

FINANCES 2013-2014

The tables below show how the net budget of the West Midlands Police and Crime Commissioner (£556.67m) is funded from Central Government, business ratepayers and the precept on council taxpayers. This is compared with the previous year (£546.48m) with the main changes shown separately below.


Spend on policing per head of population in 2013-14



This leaflet explains the finances of West Midlands Police and is prepared in accordance with Government regulations.



The cost of the precept in the West Midlands is the second lowest in the country. It can be seen in blue. The three highlighted columns offer comparisons with the three other neighbouring forces in the West Midlands region.

In 2013-2014, the cost of running the Police and Crime Commissioner's Office will be £2,000,000.00 £110,000 **less** than it cost in 2012-2013.



Unfair implementation of the funding formula
