

You submitted a Freedom of Information request to this office on 28 April 2017. I responded advising that the request was too broad, and suggested that you refined your request, which you subsequently did.

On 22 June 2017 I wrote again advising you of the documentation that was held by this office and asked whether provision of these documents would address your request. At that time I did point out that exemptions might be applicable.

On 26 June you confirmed that the documents highlighted would address your request.

All documentation has been considered and I am able to provide you with the following:

- A list of possible questions to be asked by the Commissioner at the public hearing scheduled for 18 March 2016.
- Highways England debrief on road traffic collision on 4 February 2016.
