1.	Welcome, Introduction, Apologies and confidentiality	<b>PM</b> opened the meeting and welcomed Insp Phil Upton who is now the lead for Scrutiny for Walsall.

		AR confirmed that all members in attendance have previously signed the confidentiality agreements
2.	Insp Phil Upton	Introduction from <b>PU</b> around his role and policing career to date.
3.	Confirmation of minutes of previous meeting	All accepted
4.	Actions from last meeting	Members had asked for confirmation on the age of person who was subject of the review of UOF Ref 127347. <b>PU</b> confirmed that the subject was aged 17.



5.	Stop & Search Data for the period: 23 <sup>rd</sup> March to 31 <sup>st</sup> May 22	PU presented Walsall S&S performance data for this period. Data is in relation to searches in Walsall carried out by Walsall NPU officers.  Total searches on WS area – 158 Positive outcome rate – 26.6% Meets required standard – 97% BWV Used – 93.7% Asian search ratio – 1.6 Black search ration – 1.7
6.	Disproportionality figures for Stop & Search	<ul> <li>PU – highlighted that the disproportionality data for Stop &amp; Search are considerably higher for non-NPU officers and depts than it is for NPU officers. Members invited to provide feedback in relation to: <ul> <li>Why is that and what should we do about it?</li> <li>What is your view on how WS NPU staff conduct Stop &amp; Search and what should we do about it?</li> </ul> </li> <li>PU advised that a survey link will be emailed to panel members to request feedback in relation to the above.</li> <li>PU made the panel aware of the new Race Action Plan. AR will also follow up with email.</li> </ul>
7.	Serious Violence Reduction Orders – (SVRO's)	PU presented the ongoing work in relation to SVRO's and that WMP would be piloting this initiative.  Feedback from the panel has been recorded and PU will review Members will be emailed the government consultation link
8.	Review of dip samples of stop and search and Use of Force from 23/03/22 to 31/05/22	PM Confirmed that the records to be reviewed have been randomly selected prior to the meeting.  The below Use of Force BWV references were chosen by PM and were reviewed during the meeting.  436380 – BWV reviewed, no concerns raised by the panel. Panel noted that subject was stood up quickly and not left on floor. Panel asked if officers are trained to place subjects in front/against walls. PU confirmed he is not aware that this is taught in training.  442196 – The panel felt that given the seriousness of this incident the officers' actions and language were proportionate. Members also asked if there was any follow up support for the officers PU advised that this will have been done by supervision.  492940 – BWV reviewed and no concerns raised by panel  493369 – BWV reviewed and no concerns raised by panel
