

Dear FOI Applicant,

Thank you for your freedom of information request received in this office on **7 February** 2024 in which you asked:

'I would like to know when the latest collaboration was signed and agreed between both forces, are there any exit clauses and cost implications to either that would be detrimental to the public purse and will the agreement be made available for public viewing and when?'

I have split your request into three sections, and in response to your request, I can confirm the following:

- 1. I would like to know when the latest collaboration was signed and agreed between both forces **The General Agreement was signed 11<sup>th</sup> March 2019.**
- Are there any exit clauses and cost implications to either that would be detrimental to the public purse – All staff and assets under CMPG are owned by either West Midlands Police or Staffordshire police. On exit, each force would take responsibility for any staff employed by them. Should there be any costs associated with terminating the agreement, each force would be responsible for a share of these costs on the ratio of West Midlands Police 70%, Staffordshire Police 30%.
- 3. Will the agreement be made available for public viewing and when there are no plans to publish and no proposed date for publication.

## **Freedom of Information Right of Appeal**

Any person who has requested information from the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner (OPCC) and is unhappy with the way their request for information has been handled can request a review of their case.

A request for review must be made in writing by letter or email. You should include the reference number of your request if you have it, and outline why you are requesting the review to:

All requests for review will be recorded. Receipt of a request for internal review will be acknowledged and the appellant informed of an estimated date for determining the outcome. The OPCC will attempt to respond to internal reviews as soon as practicable and in any case within two months. All investigations will be undertaken by someone not involved in the original response.

The result of any internal review will be communicated to the appellant outlining the decisions taken.

If you remain dissatisfied with the handling of your request or complaint, you have a right to appeal to the Information Commissioner at:
